If you have a Ralphs card, live in California, and are not already linked to another nonprofit in the Ralphs Community Contribution Program, you are eligible to participate. This is good for one year and then next September, you can continue to support us by relinking your card to our branch.

This is an ongoing fundraiser for Tech Trek. You must register online each year on or after September 1.

Go to the www.ralphs.com website. If you are already an online Ralphs customer, click on "Sign In" in the top right hand corner. If you don't have an online Ralphs account, click on "No Account? Register" in the top right hand corner and follow the steps to create an online account.

When you are signed in as an online Ralphs customer, link your Ralphs card to your organization by clicking on "Community Rewards - Enroll" or "Community Rewards – Re-enroll". Type our NPO number (94583) or our organization name (AAUW Alhambra/San Gabriel Branch). Remember to click on the circle to the left of our organization name. Click on ENROLL to finish your enrollment process.
