To guarantee equality, individual rights, and social justice in a diverse society, AAUW advocates many issues--including freedom from violence, fear of violence and hate crimes in homes, schools, workplaces, and communities.

Unfortunately, American students are not free from violence. Sen. Dianne Feinstein (D-Calif) pointed out a disturbing trend in our schools: "Since Sandy Hook (Dec. 14, 2012), around 250 schools have experienced a shooting. That's an average of around 50 a year, or one school shooting every week," she said. "It's astonishing that so many schools and so many children have suffered. Active shooter drills shouldn't be a way of life for our children, but sadly they are."

Singer Kelly Clarkson has also expressed sadness at the escalating level of violence in our schools, and stated that the time for 'moments of silence' is over. "Why don't we do a moment of action?" she asked. "Why don't we do a moment of change?"

In February, 2018, after their tragedy, the students of Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Florida, seized a moment for change. They created "March For Our Lives" and launched a national movement.

Three months later, another deadly school shooting took place, this time in Texas.

How can we--students, parents, faculty, our communities, and organizations such as AAUW--eliminate violence aimed at our schools? What actions can we take to prevent another tragedy from taking place?

Speech Trek is an annual speaking contest open to all California high school students, whether from public, private, home or continuation high schools. Students prepare an original 5-6-minute speech, which is judged for content, organization, and delivery. The best speech will be posted online to be judged for the next level.

The state Speech Trek judges will identify five finalists, two of whom will receive honorable mention. The judges will award the 4th place finalist with \$250 and the 5th place finalist with \$150. The top three contestants in the state will compete for cash prizes at the AAUW California annual meeting in San Diego on April 6, 2019. First place winner at the State contest will receive \$1500, second place will receive \$1000, and third place will receive \$500. Travel expenses, lodging, and meals for each finalist and a chaperone will be reimbursed by Speech Trek.

The first Speech Trek final competition was held at the April 2007 state convention. AAUW's Alhambra--San Gabriel Branch branch has participated every year and has had finalists place among the top three on six occassions: Peggy Truong (3rd in 2007), Tiffany Chia (3rd in 2008), Alexandra Lossada (2nd in 2009), PavinTrinh (1st in 2013), Sharon Lu (1st in 2016, pictured right), Sabrina Sy (3rd in 2017) and Sharon Lu (1st in 2016).

Thanks to the more than 500 who contributed to the AAUW California Public Policy Priorities revision and renewal. The Public Policy Committee is reviewing member input. Look for the proposed new priorities documented in the winter edition of the Perspective.

January begins the new state legislative session. Legislators will be introducing bills through February 22. Our advocate and the Public Policy Committee will be determining which bills address issues relating to our mission. As bills are selected for further action by AAUW, they will be posted online. AAUW California signed on to a letter from AAUW National urging the new Congress to take the next step toward equal pay and make passing the Paycheck Fairness Act a priority. You will be hearing more about this effort from AAUW National.

UNDER PAPA'S PICTURE






