

This brings to mind 2021's Equal Pay Days (AAUW), i.e., how far into the new year women must work to be paid what men were paid in the previous year:

Asian American & Pacific Islander Women's Equal Pay Day (3/9/2021)

\$0.85 for every dollar paid to white men.

All Women's Equal Pay Day (3/24/2021) \$0.82 for every dollar...

Mothers' Equal Pay Day (5/5/2021) \$0.70 for every dollar...

Black Women's Equal Pay Day (8/3/2021) \$0.63 for every dollar...

Native American Women's Equal Pay Day (9/8/2021) \$0.60 for every dollar...

## PUBLIC POLICY SUMMARY

WELCOME TO THE MONTHLY PUBLIC POLICY section of the **Mission Gateway**! My goal for the coming year is to keep members up to date on the progress of legislation that will improve the lives of California women and girls. AAUW CA is currently co-sponsoring or watching 39 bills. 18 are still active; one dealing with childcare and education has been signed. Our state's Legislative Update directly impacts our communities and our lives: where we live, work and spend our time and finances. It's up to each of us to inform ourselves. Let me know if there is any particular area or issue, you'd like to know more about!

REMEMBER TO VOTE in the CA GUBERNATORIAL RECALL ELECTION. Did you receive your ballot? Did you turn it in? Deadline to turn in your ballot is September 14th.

#### LEGISLATIVE UPDATE: LEGISLATURE IS CURRENTLY IN SESSION

- The Legislature reconvened on August 16th after their one-month summer hiatus.
- AB92, a bill related to preschool and childcare services and fees that we are co-sponsoring, is now in Senate Appropriations.
- Of our initial list of 39 bills on which AAUW California took positions or is watching, one has been signed by the Governor (re-hiring employees displaced by the pandemic) and 18 are still active.

#### State Budget was Signed by Governor Newsom

A one-time influx of federal funds plus unanticipated California tax revenue increases have enabled addressing some issues that will significantly improve child care and education.

### The budget:

- Adds 200,000 more subsidized child care spaces, which would almost double the state's total supply.
- Increases the amount the state pays to child care providers for each subsidized child, (although the details have yet to be ironed out).
- Creates transitional kindergarten (TK) for all 4-year-olds.
- Extends the school year and school day for all low-income elementary students.
- Provides \$115 million to develop pathways for an associate degree in which students don't have to spend money on textbooks.
- Provides state-funded breakfast and lunches for all students, starting this fall.
- Invests \$2.8 billion to turn about a third of the state's 10,000 schools into community schools that provide health care, family services, and after-school programs through local partnerships.
- Provides \$4 billion for a mental health and behavior system that will provide screenings, counseling, and therapy from birth through age 25.

Tech Trek Virtual Camp has just finished. There were approximately 600 girls and 76 branches that participated in California. Tech Trek North and Tech Trek South had 19 girls in the virtual program this summer. There were many challenges, a few problems and what an amazing opportunity our girls had to participate in this program.

Truly a rigorous curriculum: Each camper had to participate in the five morning sessions, mandatory daily workshops and two out of the eight workshops to be eligible for the Tech Trek certificate and future junior counselor assignments. Girls and parents were told this time and time again.

The September AAUW program [Monday - 9/20] will highlight the TT Virtual Camp. We will share with you what the week looked like, what it meant to build a Robotics hat and make a Flipgrid video. We hope that a few of the girls will join us on Zoom for the meeting.

Pictured is one of the TT Kits. Each girl received this kit with all the materials that they would need for the week of activities. Our branch gave the girls a TT Bear.

Now begins planning the 2022 Tech Trek camp. At the present time we do not know how it will look – virtual, residential or a combination. We are hoping to know more in October. Our committees are ready to get to work on fundraising and recruitment.

### AAUW ALHAMBRA-SAN GABRIEL BRANCH SCHOLARSHIP

As we move forward, our AAUW Branch commitment to Education takes <u>additional</u> shape as a scholarship fund at East Los Angeles College (ELAC)—to be directed primarily at young women graduates from the high schools in the communities we serve.

Our initial scholarship is set to be awarded in the 2022 Spring Semester. Our local high schools will be contacted to apprise them of this financial aid opportunity. A \$500 scholarship will be awarded each semester to one student who has completed the following criteria: (1) earned 24 units with at least a 2.0 GPA; (2) submitted an essay: *How My Education Will Enable Me to Give Back to My Community*; and (3) plans to transfer to a 4-year institution for a degree in a STEM field (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics).

We will also consider how we can make our Tech Trekkers aware of this scholarship opportunity as part of our burgeoning Tech Trek Alumni Group.

Hear from our member Kiem Tjong, expressing her joy to engage in this giving opportunity:

"A donation to our scholarship fund is not only an investment in the promise of our young people. It is also a way to acknowledge our own successes in life; it's a way to give back and share the help each of us received in our own lives. And finally, it is a way that each of us can add our voice to what tomorrow's society will look like."

- Student/students enrolled in Science, Engineering, Technology, and Math as these students will be full-time ELAC students having already completed 24 credits, focusing on female student/students
- GPA of 2.0 or Higher; Plans to transfer to a 4-year institution for a STEM degree
- 500-Word Essay on the Subject: How My Education Will Enable me to Give Back to My Community
