On the national scene, the Confirmation of Ketanji Brown Jackson as Associate Justice of the Supreme Court is both momentous and overdue. Yet it highlights the fact that a highly qualified Black Woman under consideration for appointment is still subjected to nothing short of psychological abuse at the hands of senators whose names are all too familiar. It is now fully understandable how U.S. Attorney General Garland was refused even a Senate hearing by the political party in control at the time. But Ketanji Brown Jackson *nevertheless persisted* and will be the Court's First Black Female Associate Justice! Let that sink in—the Court's first Black Associate Justice and only its sixth woman. Couple this with the fact that of 114 Supreme Court Justices, only 6 were non-white men!

Locally, our Branch debuted *Brave Resilient Women* in Reader's Theater to a near capacity crowd of 90 people on *continued on Page 2*

March 19<sup>th</sup>. This production garnered praise and thanks for illuminating women whose accomplishments were hardly recognized at the time. And it has educated our audience to the need to look for additional women who have fallen beneath the veil of recorded history, but whose perseverance deserves recognition, regardless of the belatedness of the accolades.

One thing that drives my involvement is a belief in the absolutely essential work helping those women and girls in our communities to prosper even though we may not see the heights they attain nor the societal gains they underpin. Younger generations that our values inspire will make the inroads we desire.

Our *Creative Crafters and Branch Members* contributed 25 handmade blankets, along with a sizeable check for \$1100 to the La Casa Preschool.

Our *Tech Trek* and *Speech Trek* programs continue reaching young people in our community.

Colorful Stories fills a void in elementary school literature that has far too few stories with successful, diverse, ethnic protagonists with which our young students can identify.

The *Branch's East Los Angeles College (ELAC) Scholarship* puts our "Money where our mouths are" by providing the means for women to enter and continue their studies in fields of Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM). These essential career choices for societies' betterment and advancement have been far too long underrepresented with women. While half our population is female, we have but small percentages of women in STEM fields.

Breaking down barriers to full participation by women in our US society and economy does not come easily, nor quickly. It requires our continued vigilance and engagement in both ceiling-breaking and opportunity promotion.

We who enjoy the fruits of education are the best ambassadors for inclusive education, regardless of the field of study, for all women and girls no matter where they live. Our world is a global yet local one. And while we must think globally, we must act locally. What we don't choose to do slows our achievement of Vision: Equity for ALL; and Mission: Advocacy for women and girls through



## **PUBLIC POLICY**

#### **AAUW CA SPONSORS CALIFORNIA LEGISLATION**

Guided by our member-approved Public Policy Priorities for 2021-2023, the AAUW California Public Policy Committee has selected the bills that we will be supporting as they move through the 2022 Session of the California Legislature. Here are the six highest priority bills:

- AB 92—creates an equitable sliding scale for family fees to alleviate the burden on working families struggling to pay for childcare and early childhood education services. Co- sponsor
- AB 1666—enables persons to come from outside California for abortions and not be impacted by laws of other states. Co-sponsor
- AB 1968—mandates the creation of websites at CSU/UC campuses to assist sexual assault survivors.
- AB 2881—Student parents get priority enrollment, registration, and access to basic needs centers, enabling them to remain in California colleges.
- **SB 523**—Expands contraceptive coverage by requiring health plans to provide point-of-sale coverage without cost-sharing.
- **SB** 1375—updates statutes relating to abortion care to allow nurse practitioners to practice under standard protocols to provide first-trimester abortion care.

Within our Public Policy Priorities, six bills are related to Economic Security for All Women, seven are related to Equal Access to Public Education, and 18 are related to Social and Racial Justice for all Members of Society.


AAUW California is experiencing greater visibility among elected legislators by sponsoring/co-sponsoring bills.

dangerously out of touch and out of power in the places where it counts the most.


This high-stakes thriller of international intrigue features behind-the-scenes global drama informed by details only an insider could know.


## Drama

Drama will meet May 9, 2022 at 7:00 p.m. over Zoom to read Sweat by Lynn Nottage, winner of the 2017 Pulitzer Prize (6M,3F) and on June 13, 2022 same time and place, to read Nude with Violin by Noel Coward (8M/6F)



In one of the poorest cities in America, Reading, Pennsylvania, a group of down-and-out factory workers struggles to keep their present lives in balance, ignorant of the financial devastation looming in their near futures. Set in 2008, the powerful crux of this new play is knowing the fate of the characters long before it's even in their sights.

Based on Nottage's extensive research and interviews with real residents of Reading, Sweat is a topical reflection of the present and poignant outcome of America's economic decline.



Noel Coward attempts to satirize modern art in a comedy about the death of an artist whose work was, in fact, painted by at least three others. It opened in 1956 and was slated by many critics but ran for a year in London.
