Continuing our Democracy requires that we are "all in". First, be a voter; second, encourage friends and family often to be sure to vote. And remember, "The only thing necessary for the triumph of evil is for good people to do nothing." At best, the essence of the quote can be traced back to the utilitarian philosopher John Stuart Mill, who delivered an 1867 inaugural address at the University of St Andrews and stated: "Let not any one pacify his conscience by the delusion that he can do no harm if he takes no part, and forms no opinion. Bad men need nothing more to compass their ends, than that good men should look on and do nothing. He is not a good man who, without a protest, allows wrong to be committed in his name, and with the means which he helps to supply, because he will not trouble himself to use his mind on the subject." COLORFUL STORIES

Colorful Stories is a project of Alhambra-San Gabriel Branch AAUW to provide students in Alhambra Unified School District, San Gabriel Unified School District and Montebello Unified School District with books that feature persons of color as protagonists and heroes in order to foster respect for people from different races, religions, and cultures.

In 2020-2021, the inaugural year, 41 books were purchased for Alhambra School District with \$250 seed money. In 2021-2022 donations increased and the project expanded to include San Gabriel and Montebello School Districts with \$500 available for each district. Unfortunately, purchases were not made in 2021-2022 by any of the districts. However, the money donated was carried over to the 2022-2023 school year augmented by continuing donations. So far this year, San Gabriel Unified School District has purchased 80 books and Alhambra Unified School District has notified us that they have selected and purchased their books. Kathleen Doty presented the check and bookplates identifying Alhambra-San Gabriel Branch as the donor to the San Gabriel teacher who was selected to receive our donation, Lisa Woo, on September 15th. Presentation date and time for Alhambra is to be determined. We are still waiting to hear from Montebello Unified School District.

You, too, may be part of this wonderful project by sending a check to Kathleen Doty payable to Alhambra-San Gabriel Branch AAUW. Please note Colorful Stories on the check. Efforts to have the Colorful Stories project finances handled by AAUW CA Special Projects Fund, thereby allowing donations to be tax deductible, are ongoing.

Into Julia's regimented world step two outsiders—Doctor Kathleen Lynn, a rumoured Rebel on the run from the po-

lice, and a young volunteer helper, Bridie Sweeney.


In the darkness and intensity of this tiny ward, over three days, these women change each other's lives in unexpected ways. They lose patients to this baffling pandemic, but they also shepherd new life into a fearful world. With tireless tenderness and humanity, careers and mothers alike somehow do their impossible work.

In The Pull of the Stars, Emma Donoghue once again finds the light in the darkness in this new classic of hope and survival against all odds.

Drama will gather on the 10th of October at Kathleen Doty's home to read <u>The Amen Corner</u> by James Baldwin.



Only a boy preacher who had grown up to become one of America's most eminent writers could have produced a play like The Amen Corner. For to his first work for the theater James Baldwin brought all the fervor and majestic rhetoric of the storefront churches of his childhood along with an unwavering awareness of the price those churches exacted from their worshipers.

For years Sister Margaret Alexander has moved her Harlem congregation with a mixture of personal charisma and ferocious piety. But when Margaret's estranged husband, a scapegrace jazz musician, comes home to die, she is in danger of losing both her standing in the church and the son she has tried to keep on the godly path.

The Amen Corner is a play about faith and family, about the gulf between black men and black women and black fathers and black sons. It is a scalding, uplifting, sorrowful and exultant masterpiece of the modern American theater.
