

*[Psychology is considered a science because of the breadth of rigorous research, evaluation and analysis involved. It begins with the scientific method and researchers employ many of the same methods as their colleagues in the natural and physical sciences, but psychology also calls for a deep understanding of human behavior that goes beyond science alone.]

#2: My name is **Sydney Zheng** and I am a rising sophomore at East Los Angeles College. My major is biology, and I plan on transferring to the University of California Irvine or the University of California Los Angeles in Fall 2024. I have been doing biotechnology and microbiology research at Cal State LA and have enjoyed the field thus far. FYI: Two Important AAUW-CA Public Policy Items-The California School Board Project and The Equal Rights Amendment

- 1. The California School Board Project. We are hosting an important webinar on September 21st entitled *Book Banning and Curricula Censorship in California? AAUW California to the Rescue!* For an article on this critical issue which is rapidly sweeping across the country, and the School Board Project, click HERE. Public Policy committee members will explain the breadth of the problem and the scope of the proposed solution. They'll be joined by a member from Equality California, our collaborative partner, and a representative from the League of Women Voters. You'll gain useful tips about speaking out at school board meetings. We encourage you and your branch members to join us for this webinar to learn about the School Board Project and how you can take action. To register, click HERE.
- 2. The Equal Rights Amendment (ERA). This year marks the 100th anniversary of the introduction of the ERA. AAUW's 2023-25 Public Policy Priorities state that we advocate for ratification and passage of the ERA "to guarantee equality, individual rights, and social justice for a diverse and inclusive society." We are happy to report that multiple paths are being pursued in the current session of Congress to affirm the ERA as the 28th amendment. Right now, we could use your help to finally make this a reality!

One of the paths that looks fruitful for advancing the ERA is passage of a <u>discharge petition for House Joint Resolution 25 (H.J. Res. 25</u>). This will allow there to be a vote to remove the current ratification deadline for the ERA. Here in California, there are two members of Congress who are a focus of critical outreach because of their demonstrated bipartisanship:

- CA-13 Rep. John Duarte
- CA-41 Rep. Ken Calvert

If your branch is in one of these districts, please ask your members to reach out to your representative and urge them to sign the discharge petition H.J. Res. 25. When you call, make sure to note that you are a constituent. If you are not sure what to say, you are welcome to use the message below:

We're asking for your office to sign the discharge petition on House Joint Resolution 25 (H.J. Res. 25). This would simply allow there to be a vote on the resolution to remove the ratification deadline and affirm the Equal Rights Amendment as the 28th Amendment to the Constitution.

The basic version is free and can be installed from Zoom (zoom.us) or by clicking on the meeting link provided by the meeting host and following the prompts. Installation will take a few minutes, so if Zoom hasn't already been installed, link early.
