

Dr. Scott and his wife Mary became friends with Ms. Piczek in 2013. When Isabel passed in 2016, the Scotts took up the task of completing *The Universe Speaks: The Monumental Sacred Arts of Isabel and Edith Piczek*. They photographed Isabel and her sister's works in stained-glass, mosaic and mural forms. These masterpieces beautify churches and public buildings in seven countries on three continents. The stained-glass windows as well as two large murals on each side of the alter at Saint Anthony's Catholic Church nearby on San Gabriel Blvd. are examples of the Piczek sisters' artistry.



AAUW California Family,

This April, we will have the opportunity to practice the inclusion that we value by voting to welcome any person who is passionate about equity for women into AAUW, whether they have a degree or not.

AAUW National is proposing a bylaws amendment to eliminate the degree requirement for membership. On January 20th, the AAUW California Board of Directors unanimously approved a statement of support for the bylaws change.

We'd like to share our reasoning with you.

Our organization was founded in 1881 to advance opportunities for women and to work toward equal treatment with men. While the early members focused on increasing the number of women going to college, they also worked to make employment of women and children safer and began the fight for pay equity. As AAUW evolved to meet women's needs, the organization and its impact grew. Our focus expanded to include advocating for the needs of people of color and individuals/communities in poverty. The efforts of AAUW earned us permanent United Nations (U.N.) observer status which in turn led to AAUW members expanding the fight for civil rights and an overall deeper understanding and appreciation of those who are marginalized.

Throughout the past 143 years, AAUW members never stopped advocating for education while expanding our focus to ensuring policies around maternity leave, reproduction rights, equal pay, and policies against sexual harassment and violence against women. Welcoming those without a degree will not change who we are and what we are working towards- it will enhance our efforts by including anyone who is as passionate as we are about equity for women and girls. AAUW and its eligibility requirements have changed substantially over the years and yet, we still work together and strive to make women's lives better and we will continue to do so for years to come. Treating each other fairly and supporting one another with compassion is the foundation of AAUW and serves as the catalyst for current and future efforts. As we enter a time of uncertainty in our nation, we need to band together and continue to advocate for a better future.

We encourage you to practice the inclusion our founding members worked for and vote "yes"- watch for your ballot in April.

Tech Trek Update March 2024



Tech Trek Recruitment for 2024 is underway. Both Jane and I have contacted the schools in TT North and TT South. We asked each school to submit two recommendations from their school. The parents must agree to let their daughter be nominated. After Jane and I have received the school nominations we notify the parents and the school liaison that they need to register with CAMPDOC. We provide the link to CAMPDOC so the parents can begin the online registration. Once the parents have sent in the Instructions to Allow Your Child to Apply, they will be in the system and may begin the camp registration process. Jane and I log into CAMPDOC weekly or sooner if necessary to monitor their progress.

Branch members can volunteer to help at Whittier camp during one or both sessions. Whittier Session 1 June 16-22 or Whittier Session 2 June 23-29. DRAMA



BOOKS



When a white servant girl violates the order of plantation society, she unleashes a tragedy that exposes the worst and best in the people she has come to call her family. Orphaned while onboard ship from Ireland, seven-year-old Lavinia arrives on the steps of a tobacco plantation where she is to live and work with the slaves of the kitchen house. Under the care of Belle, the master's illegitimate daughter, Lavinia becomes

deeply bonded to her adopted family, though she is set apart from them by her white skin.

Eventually, Lavinia is accepted into the world of the big house, where the master is absent and the mistress battles opium addiction. Lavinia finds herself perilously straddling two very different worlds. When she is forced to make a choice, loyalties are brought into question, dangerous truths are laid bare, and lives are put at risk. **Evening Books** will meet March 25, 2024 at 7:00 pm.. The book for review is <u>The River We Remember</u> by William Kent Krueger.



On Memorial Day in Jewel, Minnesota, the body of wealthy landowner Jimmy Quinn is found floating in the Alabaster River, dead from a shotgun blast. The investigation falls to Sheriff Brody Dern, a highly decorated war hero who still carries the physical and emotional scars from his military service. Even before Dern has the results of the autopsy, vicious rumors begin to circulate that the killer must be Noah Blue-

stone, a Native American WWII veteran who has recently returned to Jewel with a Japanese wife. As suspicions and accusations mount and the town teeters on the edge of more violence, Dern struggles not only to find the truth of Quinn's murder but also put to rest the demons from his own past.

Caught up in the torrent of anger that sweeps through Jewel are a war widow and her adolescent son, the intrepid publisher of the local newspaper, an aging deputy, and a crusading female lawyer, all of whom struggle with their own tragic histories and harbor secrets that Quinn's death threatens to expose.
