

Just a reminder about some options for our available Fund donations:

Do you want them to go toward finishing a Fellowship? It can take years to finish a Fellowship. Remember, only the interest from each Fellowship is used to fund the over 6 million dollars in grants and fellowships AAUW awarded this year and the interest is not available until a Fellowship is complete. (There is a list available of unfinished fellowships in California to which we can donate.) Let me know if that is where you want your donation to go.

Another option is AAUW Greatest Needs (9110) which allows AAUW the flexibility to respond rapidly to new and emerging challenges facing women and girls and to utilize your gift where it is needed the most. The fund ensures the strength, relevance, and visibility of AAUW into the future.

The Leadership Fund (4452) supports the effort to close the gender gap in leadership opportunities by bolstering the participation of and increasing the number of girls and women in leadership roles particularly in education and nonprofit organizations.

Education and Training (4450) addresses the barriers and implicit biases that hinder the advancement of women by championing equal access to education and ensuring that education at every level is free from sex discrimination.

Economic Security Fund (4449) ensures livelihood for women through achieving pay equity for women providing training in salary negotiation, and deepening women's retirement security and quality of life.

### **APRIL 2024 PUBLIC POLICY NEWS**

#### FOR THE STATE PUBLIC POLICY COMMITTEE, MARCH DEFINITELY ROARED IN LIKE A LION!

This month has certainly kept the Public Policy Committee on our toes! As a result, AAUW California members now have 30 bills that are being advocated for in the state legislature. Members visited 57 legislative offices to advocate for the top three of those bills during Lobby Days. We will also have the chance to vote on 11 proposed changes that have been made to the Public Policy Priorities.

Our Bill Tracker chart has been posted on the Public Policy page of the AAUW California website and can be viewed HERE.

Thanks to the 120 members from 56 branches who participated in Lobby Days. If you were a Team Leader, please be sure to get your Report Back form to the Public Policy Committee ASAP if you haven't done so already.

#### **PUBLIC POLICY PRIORITIES**

Finally, the committee wants to thank all the members who took the time to weigh in on updates to our Public Policy Priorities for 2023-25. The committee has reviewed all 466 comments and agreed on 11 modifications based on members' input. Not all suggestions were incorporated for a variety of reasons. Our three main criteria for edits were:

- 1. Is it within our mission?
- 2. Does it address a new issue germane to current circumstances?
- 3. Would adding it inform the public as to an important AAUW California position, provide guidance for the Public Policy Committee on forming our Legislative Agenda, and/or provide guidance to our membership in shaping their branches' public policy positions and programs?

Many suggestions did not meet one or more of these criteria and were therefore not incorporated. The Board of Directors has approved the suggested changes, and it is now up to members to vote yes or no. Click <a href="HERE">HERE</a> to view the proposed changes.

## Hygiene Kit Collection Project a Success!

Branch members demonstrated their generosity and compassion in donating thirty-two hygiene kits for teens and tweens in foster care. Toothpaste, a toothbrush, shampoo, conditioner and a sturdy hairbrush, deodorant, hygiene pads, lip gloss and, most important of all, a note of support and humor, filled the colorful toiletry bags that will be packed in new suitcases filled with clothes and shoes. Girls in foster care receive these from Hope in a Suitcase, a volunteer project based in Los Angeles.

Tiffany White, branch Treasurer, presented the Hygiene Kit Collection project at the AAUW Alhambra-San Gabriel Branch, January Board meeting and it was adopted with enthusiasm. Tiffany demonstrated her technical expertise in creating an Amazon Hygiene Kit Registry where donors shopped for articles that the committee suggested and then sent them to her home.

On Saturday morning, February 24, the Hygiene Kit Collection Committee met at Tiffany's, assembled the kits, collaborated on writing supportive, encouraging notes for each girl and slipped them into the hygiene kits. Both groups will review <u>Black Cake</u> by Charmaine Wilkerson.



In present-day California, Eleanor Bennett's death leaves behind a puzzling inheritance for her two children, Byron and Benny: a black cake, made from a family recipe with a long history, and a voice recording. In her message, Eleanor shares a tumultuous story about a headstrong young swimmer who escapes her island

home under suspicion of murder. The heartbreaking tale Eleanor unfolds, the secrets she still holds back, and the mystery of a long-lost child challenge everything the siblings thought they knew about their lineage and themselves.

Can Byron and Benny reclaim their once-close relationship, piece together Eleanor's true history, and fulfill her final request to "share the black cake when the time is right"? Will their mother's revelations bring them back together or leave them feeling more lost than ever?

Charmaine Wilkerson's debut novel is a story of how the inheritance of betrayals, secrets, memories, and even names can shape relationships and history. Deeply evocative and beautifully written, Black Cake is an extraordinary journey through the life of a family changed forever by the choices of its matriarch.
