## SEPTEMBER 2025 PUBLIC POLICY NEWS


The deadline for action on current legislation in the California legislature is September 12th. To find the status of the bills being followed by AAUW CA go to:

It's the Sunshine Committee's pleasure to shine the spotlight on our **55-Year AAUW Life Member Delora Brown** who recently moved from Temple City to be near relatives in Reno, Nevada. This past August we were fortunate to speak with Delora to discover how she is settling in so far at her new home. **Promenade on the River.** For us her Branch Friends, here is an account of our conversation.

Delora said that at first the hardest part of her transition was **not having her car**, as she had sold her house and car upon leaving Temple City. She was finding it difficult to drive, especially at night, due to poor vision. But fortunately, this did not remain an issue as she soon discovered that there are so many amenities on the premises of her independent living complex. Among them is a shuttle that takes residents to the mall, grocery shopping and to any types of appointments that are needed. You just sign up for the shuttle on a convenient signup sheet in the mailroom. She pays rent monthly and there are canes, walkers and caregivers available as needed.

Delora says she feels "spoiled" for the first time in her life. She receives three meals a day; housekeeping; and a washing machine and TV in her apartment. **She does not need to cook.** One niece, **Diana**, lives close and recently brought her fresh peaches and fruit. And meals at **Promenade** are varied every day. She may choose her lunch and dinner entrees and sides! In the dining room everyone may sit where they wish. Delora says that there are about 100 lovely people living at the facility and 81 rooms. Fifteen of her relatives live nearby and all get together on special occasions. A most wonderful benefit of her new life is that Delora is living with her niece **Michelle**. They have a good time together. Usually, they join relatives for Sunday Family Dinners at local restaurants and coffee shops. Delora has now mastered the art of UBER and can swiftly calls for drivers whenever she and Michelle wish to dine out.

Delora plays Bridge twice a week. There's a pool for swimming, stretching and exercise. She gets her hair done with the House Hair Stylist, as well as readily available manicures and pedicures. She joins an exercise class three times weekly and says, "I love it!" Another amenity is "Happy Hour Thursdays" followed by live entertainment! Did we mention that every Friday is Movie Night???!!! The facility also offers excursions. One such trip was a Splendid Picnic in the Park at Bowers Mansion and Museum. The Bowers Family founded a silver and gold mining enterprise in Virginia City. Delora really loved that trip because of the rich history of the land where she now lives. The capper was a stop at a Chocolate Factory on the way back home! Tomorrow she is attending her high school reunion in Winnemucca!

EXTRA SPECIAL!!! A loving message that Delora wished to impart to us is: "I miss all of you."

### Branch Awards Scholarship to **ELAC Student**

East Los Angeles College (ELAC) graduate, Graciella Mullen, was awarded a one-thousand-dollar scholarship donated by AAUW Alhambra-San Gabriel branch at the annual ELAC Foundation scholarship ceremony held in June of this year. The ELAC Foundation awarded scholarships to 225 commendable students through 49 different scholarship programs that included the Alhambra-San Gabriel Branch. In his keynote address, Dr. Monte E. Pérez, ELAC's Interim President, praised the recipients, saying they "...have overcome significant challenges to reach this moment."


Graciella found the Alhambra-San Gabriel Scholarship information in the ELAC Foundation Scholarship Guide along with the criteria. She completed all requirements including majoring in a STEM subject area, (Natural Sciences), completing 24 units with a 3.7 G.P.A. and writing a compelling 500-word essay titled, How My Education Will Enable me to Give Back to My Community. She was interviewed by the ELAC Foundation Committee, and they apprised our branch of their choice.

In her thank you letter to the branch Graciella explained the importance of the donation. "These scholarships take off a financial burden that I am constantly worrying about. For me, being lucky enough to receive scholarships gives me motivation to be the best student I can be." Graciella will transfer to Cal State Long Beach and major in Natural Sciences.

Attending medical school in Southern California and working in the field of Oncology are Graciella's long-range goals. Presently, she works in medical records and volunteers at Los Angeles General hospital in the oncology department. Research had been her primary goal. As she experienced the total dedication of the staff with their clients, she became interested in clinical practice and now sees the value of practicing clinically as well as contributing to research. Graciella also volunteers for the "Make a Wish" Foundation where she becomes acquainted with a child who has cancer or another life-long chronic disease, discovers the child's wish and works to have it fulfilled. So far, Graciella has helped make the wish of Disneyland come true for a child.

ELAC has the largest student body of the community colleges in Los Angeles and of any community college in California. The ELAC Foundation is an independent, nonprofit organization whose mission includes philanthropic support of ELAC and empowering the communities ELAC serves through commitment to student success. Marissa Castro-Salvati, the foundation's president, congratulated the scholarship donors, saying, "This year's historic level of scholarship awards highlights the perseverance and excellence of our students, while reinforcing our mission to ensure higher education remains within reach for everyone."

The AAUW Alhambra-San Gabriel Branch ELAC Scholarship Committee was launched in September of 2021 with the support of inspired donors under the direction of Chairman, Joe Des Barres who stated, "I believe this scholarship project is an enduring legacy of Branch members' participation in local programs to advance gender equity for women and girls, our AAUW mission."
